## **Ysgol Gynradd Gymraeg Bryniago's Uniform Policy**

### **School Uniform**

The school has an official uniform and it is expected that every child wears this uniform. Uniforms are available at Picton Sports in Llanelli or on their website:

- A grey jumper/ cardigan
- A red polo shirt (available in shops across the country)
- A grey skirt or grey trousers (available in shops across the country)
- White, grey or black socks (available in shops across the country)
- Sensible shoes (available in shops across the country)

### **Summer Uniform**

- Red and white striped cotton dresses or dresses with a square pattern that are available in shops all over the country, and sensible shoes (i.e. no open sandals or flip flops - for health and safety reasons).
- A grey cardigan/ jumper Short grey trousers or light shorts.

### **Coats**

- Pupils are welcome to wear a sensible coat to school. We kindly ask pupils to wear a light jacket to school on a rainy, but mild day. We suggest that pupils wear a warmer coat when the weather is cold.

### **Gym Kit**

Shorts and a team t-shirt (red/yellow/blue/green) for inside activities, a tracksuit and trainers for outdoor activities. Year 3 and 4 pupils will require a swimming costume/ trunks for their swimming lessons.

PE footwear should be suitable, e.g. trainers, for health and safety reasons. Should a child not wearing the correct footwear then he/ she should be permitted to take part in the PE lesson e.g. by officiating, keeping score etc.

Children walk back to school after their swimming lessons, so if you do not wish for them to walk back to school with wet hair, they must wear a swimming cap. There is no time for 30 children to use one hair dryer because other areas of the curriculum must be taught as well.

The child's name should be written clearly on every piece of clothing, including trainers.

Hair/ scarfs should be kept back from their face and eyes during PE lessons. If it is long, it should be tied in a bobble. We kindly ask pupils not to wear jewellery during PE lessons, if possible. Pupils are welcome to cover the jewellery with a tape.

### **Leavers clothing (if requested)**

If parents want to produce any items for pupils who are leaving the school (Year 6) then permission must be sought from the head teacher in writing.

Parents are asked to consider the cost for parents of creating special clothing for leavers. Parents should also consider the environmental impact of creating clothing that cannot be reused.

The school is willing to consider the following:

- School PE T-shirts (red/ green/ blue/ yellow)
- Red polo shirt

The pupils can wear these as part of their school uniform during the Autumn Term - Summer Term during their last year at school (Year 6)

### **Jewellery, hair and make up**

For health and safety reasons, we kindly ask that pupils avoid wearing jewellery to school. If this is not possible then they are welcome to place a tape over the jewellery during PE lessons. If your child has brought jewellery to school, the jewellery is their responsibility at all times.

We kindly ask children not to wear nail varnish to school.

Hair should be kept tidy. Hair should be kept back from their face and eyes and if it is long, it should be tied in a bobble.

### **Medical issues**

If a child has a medical condition that can affect the clothes he/ she wears to school then we kindly ask parents to discuss this need with the school. The school is ready to work with parents/ carers – we will put the well-being of your child first.
